Mount Aloysius Board of Director's & CEO Update Submitted by Justin Gall, CEO

The year 2020 has been an exciting yet challenging year for Mount Aloysius with many new challenges thrown our way. Today, we are experiencing a time like no other. The COVID-19 pandemic continues to produce uncertainty and stress in our lives upsetting our daily rituals and routines. By now, we have all been impacted by this virus in some way or another. Despite our many challenges, this is also a time that is bringing out the best in many people. Together we leaned on each other, together we supported each other, and most importantly, together we encouraged each other to keep going. We are grateful for the dedication and commitment of our staff for always putting the health and safety of our residents first.

As you may be aware, Mount Aloysius is anxiously awaiting a vaccination clinic to take place. We are encouraging as many residents and staff as possible to get the vaccine. The population we serve has a much higher risk for getting very sick or being hospitalized and the more residents that get vaccinated, the better we can protect our community against potential outbreaks. The health and safety of our residents is always our top priority, and we are confident this vaccine will move us closer to obtaining immunity to the continued threat of re-infection.

Although this pandemic continues to gracefully redefine how we do business and interact with one another, we maintained our momentum moving projects forward. One of our goals outlined in the Strategic Plan is to specialize services by developing expertise in complex medical needs, in addition to diversifying our service array to meet the needs of our community. Our community identifies short term care and respite options as a gap for many individuals receiving services from the County Board. I am excited to announce that Mount Aloysius has obtained the necessary waiver certification to begin providing short term care and respite as a step to begin closing this gap for our community. As we move into 2021, we will continually work with the community and County Board to further identify gaps and identify new service venues to move closer to being a well-rounded provider of services to all individuals with developmental disabilities.

Finally, we have a few building enhancements identified to begin in 2021 to continually modernize our facility. Some of these projects include: new flooring in the dining room and hallways, lobby restroom remodels, new heating and cooling systems, new LED lighting, and enhanced security. We are hopeful as a vaccine becomes available; we will be able to invite you to an event so you can see all our updates in person.

I would like to end by thanking all of you for your continued support, understanding and trust throughout this past year. The national pandemic gave all of us challenges we were not prepared for; however we stuck together and made the best decisions we could in the best interest of the individuals we serve.

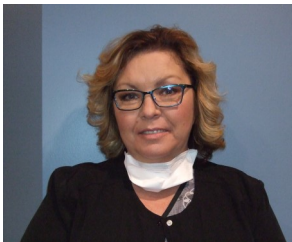
Welcome Note

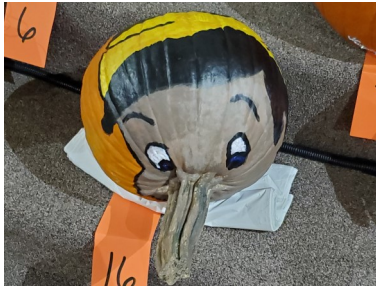

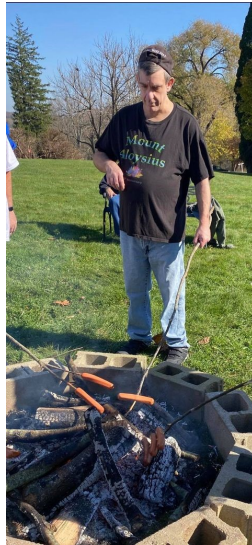
Fall Fest & Pumpkin Decorating Contest

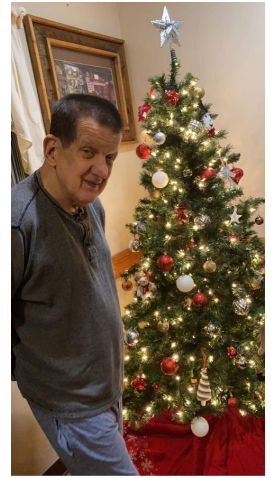
