Earth Day Timeline

1963: Senator Gaylord Nelson accompanies President John F. Kennedy on a speaking tour around the U.S. to raise awareness about environmental issues. Protecting the environment remains a low priority.

1969: Chemicals released into Cleveland's Cuyahoga River causes it to catch fire becoming symbolic of how industrial pollution is damaging America's natural resources. Senator Nelson announces idea for Earth Day, a demonstration against the degradation of America's natural resources.

1970: April 22nd 20 million people participate in activities for the **first Earth Day in the U.S.** Environmental advocacy group Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) founded. In December the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is established by President Nixon. Clean Air Act passed.

1971: Environmental activists organization Greenpeace is founded.

1972: Congress passes Clean Water Act.

1973: Congress passes the Endangered Species Act to protect animals and their ecosystems.

1980: After leaving Senate, Nelson becomes a counselor for the Wilderness Society, an environmental group.

1990: 20th Anniversary of Earth Day celebrations go global with over 140 countries participating.

1995: Nelson receives the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

2000: Hundreds of millions of people in 184 countries celebrate the 30th anniversary of Earth day focusing on Clean Energy.

2010: In honor of the 40th anniversary of Earth Day a climate rally and concert is held on the National Mall in Washington D.C.

2018: Swedish teenager and climate activist Greta Thunberg begins protesting.

2019: The United Nations Climate Summit takes place and sets deadline for achieving net zero emissions to 2050.

2020: The 50th anniversary of Earth Day centered around the theme of Climate Action.

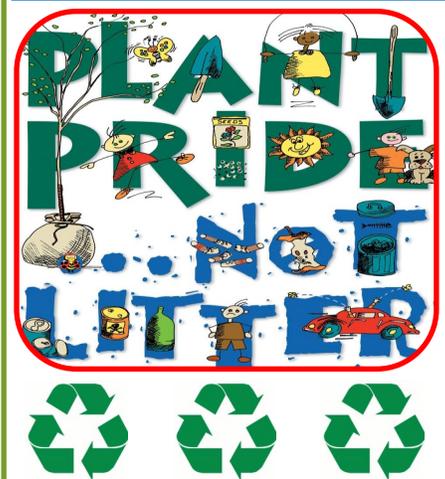
Clean Up Months
