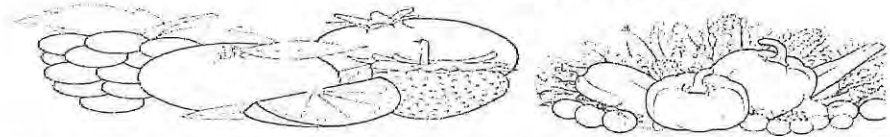

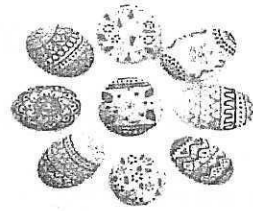

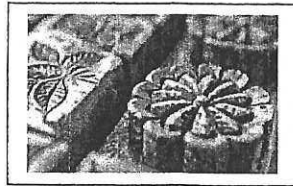
The cost is \$25 per person, the Senior Center will pay \$10 toward the cost. Class is limited to 10 SENIORS.

The class is \$25.00 per person. Class is limited to 10 SENIORS.

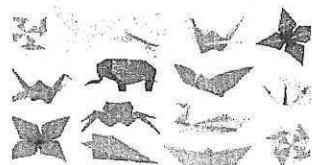
